Project Description				
The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes an emergency project to replace the damaged embankment and slopes and repair storm drain culverts on State Route Routes 26, 49, and 88 in Amador, Calaveras and San Joaquin Counties. Heavy rainfall runoff on January 16, 2023, eroded the embankment and slopes and overwhelmed culverts with debris and flows over their capacities causing them to fail at pipe joints and inlet structures. There are also numerous areas in which the slope failures have encroached past the right-of-way line and undermined telephone facilities along Route 88 in Amador County. The scope of work is listed on the Continuation Sheet. The purpose of the project is to address the damaged embankment, slope, and culverts due to recent storm. The need of this project is to prevent and mitigate the loss or impairment of life, property, or essential public services.

The existing 12" Corrugated Steel Pipe Culvert No. 260884001897, 260880002742, 260880002823, and 260880002836 will be replaced with 24" reinforced concrete pipe. The project will work off the paved roadway, require trenches, grading and other ground disturbance, constructing access roads, temporary construction easements, work in channel, tree removal, and striping removal. Additional scope of work includes:

- 1. Provide necessary traffic control and traffic control devices.
- 2. Remove all loose debris and unsuitable material.
- 3. Backfill all eroded embankment and cut slopes with suitable material.
- 4. Place rock slope protection to stabilize the slopes.
- 5. Replace all damaged culverts, headwalls, wingwalls, and drainage inlets.
- 6. Replace damaged dike.
- 7. Replace rumble and traffic striping.
- 8. Place permanent erosion control.

#### General:

 Environmental reevaluation will be required if the scope of the project changes to include additional areas or activities, or if previously unknown cultural or other sensitive resources are discovered. Contact the Environmental Office if project changes occur or sensitive resources discovered.

### Cultural:

- If cultural materials are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
  - 1. Stop all work within a 60foot radius of discovery
  - 2. Protect the discovery area
  - 3. Notify the Engineer
  - 4. The Department Investigates.

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find. Do not resume work within the discovery area until authorized.

• If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County coroner contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code (PRC) Section 5097.98. If the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) who will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At the same time the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.
