Project Location – Specific:

The project footprint is within El Dorado County and encompasses the South Fork American River and Cosumnes River watersheds. Work will focus predominately on a priority segment of Bonetti Road and a small portion of corridor along Capps Reservoir Road near the communities of Grizzly Flat, Pollock Pines, and Kyburz.

Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The Sierra Nevada Conservancy (SNC) would provide funding to treat a minimum of 450 acres of hazardous roadside vegetation to expedite priority restoration measures in high-severity burn areas on approximately 22,095 acres of Eldorado National Forest (ENF) land southeast of Pollock Pines. Funding supports the broader goal to treat an estimated 2,461 miles of hazard-tree removal along fire-impacted travel corridors in the project area. SNC funding will focus entirely on hazard-tree removal, biomass transportation, harvest inspection, and monitoring services. The project supports a year-round local workforce, enabling continued operations of wood-processing facilities while catalyzing new biomass market opportunities. Partnerships between the ENF, Great Basin Institute (GBI), members of the South Fork American River (SOFAR), and Healthy Eldorado Landscape Partnership (HELP) will ensure the necessary collaborative resources are in place to sustain fire recovery over the next 10 years.

CEQA does not apply to prescribed fire, reforestation, habitat restoration, thinning, or fuelreduction projects undertaken on federal lands to reduce the risk of high-severity wildfire that have been reviewed under NEPA if the primary role of a state or local agency is providing funding or staffing for those projects. The SNC would provide funding to conduct fuel reduction of hazardous roadside vegetation in high-severity burn areas on a minimum of 450 acres of ENF land. The proposed activities were reviewed in their entirety under NEPA in the Eldorado National Forest Roadside Hazard Tree Mitigation Project Environmental Assessment and Finding of No Significant Impact, with a Decision Notice signed in April 2023.
